# Get into the spirit!

## Bass and Flinders Distillery - 40 Collins Rd, Dromana

See how they make their small batch product range including award winning grape-based gins, spirits, brandy and liqueurs. Visitors are also welcome to participate in an informative tasting, sample a gin flight, or order a cocktail at the distillery's bar overlooking green pastures.

They offer a "Masterclass" where you can learn about blending whilst tasting a range of gins. The class not only covers the long history behind gin, you get the opportunity to create a gin tailored specifically to your taste by blending an array of botanicals. Gin Masterclasses are held at the distillery every Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

### JimmyRum - 6 Braser Avenue, Dromana

Is a craft rum distillery with an audacious goal, to change the way Australians think about rum.

Visit the working distillery in Dromana where you can experience a guided tasting and enjoy a signature cocktail with a bite to eat in the outdoor rum garden. With over 30 plus cocktails to choose from, a seasonal menu featuring local peninsula producers and award-winning spirits to taste and take home, a visit to JimmyRum is one of Mornington Peninsula's many experiences.

Enjoy music all over the weekend from knock-off drinks on Friday to Sunday afternoon classics.

### Chief's Son Distillery - 25/50 Guelph St, Somerville

Was established in 2013, by Stuart and Naomi McIntosh, and after three years of testbed success, they distilled their first commercial batch of single malt whisky. Known for the big, bold style of their product, they recently introduced a Single Malt Vodka to the range.

All whisky tastings are tailored to people's knowledge and level of interest; they explain how their whiskies are crafted and where they source the ingredients and barrels. They also cover the distilling process from malt to maturation, all with a panoramic view of the working distillery floor.

You can book a guided tour of the distillery, where you'll taste whisky direct from the barrel and take home a 100ml sample. Add a perfectly paired cheese platter if you'd prefer.

#### Penni Ave Distillery - 43 Peninsula Ave, Rye

One of the very few dedicated vodka distilleries in Victoria, their Copper Still, (named Walter), transforms fermented wheat and barley to create a wonderfully smooth vodka.

Using sustainably sourced native botanicals they have created a range of flavored vodkas.
