Mornington Combined Probus had invited Mount Eliza Probus to join them for a guided tour of the Pharoah Exhibition, 3000 years of Egyptian Art and Culture.

The exhibition had come from the British Museum, the holder of the largest and most comprehensive collection of Egyptian antiquities outside the Egyptian Museum in Cairo. Over 500 items had been selected, including monumental sculptures, tomb and temple architecture, coffins, papyri, funerary objects and an extensive display of jewellery. Here, I've chosen my favourite. - to include photos of the limestone wall from an Old Kingdom mastaba tomb, elaborately carved with hieroglyphic texts and depiction of the tomb owner.
