

Report of our Men's Coffee Club's occasion – Bob Brunton

It was a nasty cold, wet and windy Saturday morning for this month's Men's Coffee Group, and a couple of the regulars were away on holidays, so it was understandable that only four of us turned up, Lindsay Gordon, John Kent, Clarrie Woods and myself. Clarrie had been a builder, and evidently a very accomplished one. It didn't take too much encouragement for his eyes to light up with that old passion for building things. He had built all sorts of buildings, but it seems that his specialty had been scientific laboratories, having spent some thirty years at the Clayton campus of the evolving Monash University. He was obviously a problem-solver, he touched briefly on the complexities of ducting highly toxic gases out of lab fume-cupboards when there were sometimes eight floors full of innocent young students sitting above them! Clarrie was great company; we hope he keeps coming. John Kent reflected a bit on his early years working in Papua-New-Guinea, mentioning the tensions caused by the so-called '*Rascals*' of the time, and of other tests of the human spirit that come with living in such a culturally different environment. Lindsay, in his usual quiet sort of way, mentioned that at one stage when working for the SEC he was in charge of providing all the power and light requirements for all the coal-fired power stations in the Latrobe Valley. This seemed a bit weird to me, I guess I thought a power station would somehow magically light itself, but that of course is not the case. These are hugely complicated things, like big ships or small towns, and of course there would be dozens of reasons to supply its workers and technicians with light and power. It would have been a hugely complex job, but Lindsay just shrugged it off. Perhaps it may have been the mention of coal power stations that set me off on a bit of a rant about the stark reality of Climate Change, but realising that this was not a very

convivial subject to focus on I was able to rein myself in pretty quickly, not that the guys were in any sharp disagreement.

Later, as we wound up the session - John reminded us all that the real value of our free and easy discussions were the unexpected little details that came out of our random recollections.

So come on Guys join us, there is plenty of room at the table on the first Saturday morning after our monthly meetings at 'A Thousand And One Nights' at 10 o'clock.
